1. CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

Tonight's public hearing is about the proposed budget. The funding estimates and projections demonstrate that there is capacity within this CCD to grow with the Police and the community. It also shows that as the Police Department sees more complex issues, that they have the ability to pivot from this initial plan if necessary.

Action Requested

Consider Order calling an election to regarding the Crime Control and Prevention District on May 4, 2024.

Summary of Subject

In December 2023, the City Council created a Special Purpose District: a Crime Control and Prevention District (“CCPD”) (Texas Local Government Code, Chapter 363).

In accordance with State Law, the City Council can create special purpose districts, but the funding authorization must be approved by the voters in Melissa through an election.

A CCPD supports crime control and prevention programs, public safety operational expenses, and related capital purchases. The proposed District (CCPD) would collect a ¼ cent sales tax on sales within the City of Melissa that is currently dedicated to industrial economic development. These monies would be utilized to invest in policing technology, equipment, personnel, and specialized divisions.

To be funded, voters must reallocate a portion of the current sales tax dedicated to industrial economic development and redirect those funds to Police.

The election to ask the voters for reallocation of the current sales tax dedicated from industrial economic development to Police and Fire services will soon be called for the May 4, 2024 general election date. The City will contract with Collin County to conduct the election.

It is important to note that this is not a tax increase of any kind. The sales tax rate will remain the same regardless of the election outcome; the only change would be that there would be no dedicated sales tax for industrial economic development. That dedicated funding source would be split for Police and/or Fire or both services.

**MELISSA CRIME CONTROL AND PREVENTION DISTRICT
ELECTION ORDER**

AN ORDER OF THE TEMPORARY BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE MELISSA CRIME CONTROL AND PREVENTION DISTRICT, ORDERING A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE ADMINISTERED BY THE COLLIN COUNTY ELECTIONS ADMINISTRATOR ON MAY 4, 2024, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE CITY OF MELISSA THE FOLLOWING PROPOSITION: THE CREATION OF THE MELISSA CRIME CONTROL AND PREVENTION DISTRICT DEDICATED TO CRIME REDUCTION PROGRAMS, THE ADOPTION OF A PROPOSED SALES AND USE TAX AT A RATE OF 1/4 OF 1%, AND TO MAINTAIN THE SAME OVERALL SALES TAX RATE IN THE CITY, THE REDUCTION OF THE SALES AND USE TAX CURRENTLY LEVIED FOR THE PROMOTION AND DEVELOPMENT OF NEW AND EXPANDED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES BY THE MELISSA INDUSTRIAL AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION FROM A RATE OF 1/2 OF 1% TO 1/4 OF 1%; PRESCRIBING THE PROPOSITION TO BE PLACED ON THE BALLOT; SETTING FORTH SUMMARY OF APPROVED CRIME CONTROL DISTRICT PLAN AND BUDGET AND PROPOSERD TAX RATE; DESIGNATING EARLY VOTING POLLING PLACES AND HOURS; DESIGNATING ELECTION DAY POLLING PLACES AND HOURS; ORDERING NOTICES OF ELECTION TO BE GIVEN AS PRESCRIBED BY LAW IN CONNECTION WITH SUCH ELECTION; AND PROVIDING A SAVINGS/REPEALING CLAUSE, SEVERABILITY CLAUSE AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Melissa, Texas (“City Council”) is authorized to propose the creation of a Crime Control and Prevention District (“Crime Control District”) in the City of Melissa, Texas (“Melissa” or “City”) pursuant to the Crime Control and Prevention District Act, codified at Chapter 363 of the Texas Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, in Ordinance No. 2024-15, the City Council proposed the creation of the Crime Control District to cover all of the corporate boundaries of the City, as they exist or may be amended, and appointed a temporary board of directors of the Crime Control District; and

WHEREAS, the temporary board of the Crime Control District has formulated and approved the required two-year plan and two-year budget in compliance with Section 363.061 of the Texas Local Government Code, and as of the effective date of this Order, the City Council has ordered or will order an election authorizing the creation of the Crime Control District in accordance with Section 363.054 of the Texas Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, the City Council is authorized to order an election to reduce the sales and use tax rate currently levied for the promotion and development of new and expanded business enterprises by the Melissa Industrial and Economic Development Corporation, a Type A corporation, in accordance with Section 504.258 of the Texas Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, the temporary board finds that all notices, public hearings, procedures and other

actions required for the ordering of an election authorizing the creation of the Crime Control District and the reduction of the sales and use tax currently levied for the promotion and development of new and expanded business enterprises by the Melissa Industrial and Economic Development Corporation have occurred in accordance with applicable law, including Chapter 363 of the Texas Local Government Code and Chapter 504 of the Texas Local Government Code and the Texas Election Code; and

WHEREAS, the temporary board finds that adopting this Order will promote the health, safety and welfare of Melissa and is in the best interest of the citizens of Melissa.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE TEMPORARY BOARD OF THE CRIME CONTROL DISTRICT:

SECTION 1: Findings Incorporated. The findings set forth above are incorporated into the body of this Order as if fully set forth herein.

SECTION 2: Special Election Ordered. A special election (“Election”) is hereby ordered to be held on Saturday, May 4, 2024 (“Election Day”), for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of Melissa the following proposition: The creation of the Melissa Crime Control and Prevention District dedicated to crime reduction programs, the adoption of a proposed sales and use tax at a rate of 1/4 of 1%, and to maintain the same overall sales tax rate in the City, the reduction of the sales and use tax currently levied for the promotion and development of new and expanded business enterprises by the Melissa Industrial and Economic Development Corporation from a rate of 1/2 of 1% to 1/4 of 1%. The Election shall be administered by the Collin County Elections Administrator.

SECTION 3: Official Ballot Proposition. The question shall be submitted to the qualified voters of Melissa at the Election on ballots in the form of the proposition set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated as if fully set forth herein, in conformance with the requirements of Chapter 363 of the Texas Local Government Code, Chapter 504 of the Texas Local Government Code and the Texas Election Code.

SECTION 4: Summary of Approved Crime Control District Plan and Budget; Proposed Tax Rate. In accordance with Section 363.054(b)(5) of the Texas Local Government Code, attached hereto as Exhibit B is the proposed Crime Control District’s budget plan and the following is a statement, in summary form, of the crime control plan of the proposed Crime Control District: Funds from the Crime Control District’s budget will invest in technology and equipment for the Melissa Police Department, create and staff specialty divisions within the Melissa Police Department and fund additional personnel for the Melissa Police Department. The proposed sales and use tax rate for financing the operations of the Crime Control District is 1/4 of 1%. If approved, the proposed sales and use tax will be charged in addition to any other sales and use tax authorized by law and will be included in computing a combined sales and use tax rate for purposes of any limitation provided by law on the maximum combined sales and use tax rate of the City.

SECTION 5: Early Voting. Early voting by personal appearance shall be available at: the Melissa City Hall, Municipal Court Room, 3411 Barker Avenue, Melissa, Texas 75454; or the Collin County Elections Office, 2010 Redbud Blvd., Suite #102, McKinney, Texas 75069, which is designated as the main early voting polling place. Early voting will begin on Monday, April 22, 2024, and continue through

Tuesday, April 30, 2024, during the normal working hours of 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., with extended voting hours on Saturday, April 27, 2024 from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.; Monday, April 29, 2024 from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.; and Tuesday, April 30, 2024 from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Applications for ballots by mail shall be requested from and mailed to Bruce Sherbet, Early Voting Clerk, 2010 Redbud Boulevard, Suite 102, McKinney, Texas 75069, or faxed to 972-547-1996, or emailed to absenteemailballoting@collincountytx.gov. (If faxed or emailed, the original application must be mailed and received within 4 days.) Applications for ballots by mail must be received no later than the close of business on April 23, 2024.

Collin County voters may vote at any of the additional Early Voting locations open under full contract services with the Collin County Elections Administrator, which may be designated after the date of this Order. This previous sentence shall also be posted in the Notice of Election. Early voting times and locations are subject to change.

SECTION 6: Election Day Voting. Election Day voting by personal appearance shall be at the Melissa City Hall, Municipal Court Room, 3411 Barker Avenue, Melissa, Texas 75454; the Collin County Elections Office, 2010 Redbud Blvd., Suite #102, McKinney, Texas 75069; and any of the additional Election Day Vote Centers open under full contract services with Collin County Elections Administrator, from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

SECTION 7: Voting Equipment and Materials. For early voting in person, early voting by mail, election day voting and provisional voting, the following voting equipment will be used in Collin County: ES&S ExpressVote Universal voting machines (EVS 6.1.1.0), ES&S ExpressTouch curbside voting machines (EVS 6.1.1.0), ES&S DS200 ballot counters (EVS 6.1.1.0), ES&S Model DS450 and DS850 High-Speed Scanners/Tabulators (EVS 6.1.1.0), along with the required ancillary parts and services required for such voting tabulation system.

SECTION 8: Election to Comply with Applicable Laws. The City Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to publish and/or post, in the time and manner prescribed by law, all notices required to be so published and/or posted in connection with the conduct of this Election. The Election and notice of the Election shall be conducted in accordance with the Texas Election Code and other applicable law, and all qualified and registered voters of Melissa shall be eligible to vote at the Election.

SECTION 9: Authority of Mayor and City Secretary. The Mayor and the City Secretary, in consultation with the City Attorney, are hereby authorized and directed to take any and all actions necessary to comply with the provisions of the Texas Election Code and any other state or federal law in carrying out and conducting the Election, whether or not expressly authorized herein.

SECTION 10: Severability. Should any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Order be declared unconstitutional and/or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, it is expressly provided that any and all remaining portions of this Order shall remain in full force and effect. The temporary board hereby declares that it would have passed this Order, and each section, subsection, clause and phrase thereof regardless of whether any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases may be declared unconstitutional and/or invalid.

SECTION 11: Savings/Repealing. All provisions of any order in conflict with this Order are

hereby repealed to the extent they are in conflict. Any remaining portion of conflicting orders shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 12: Effective Date. This order for an election becomes effective immediately upon its passage.

The creation of the Melissa Crime Control and Prevention District dedicated to crime reduction programs, the adoption of a proposed sales and use tax at a rate of 1/4 of 1%, and to maintain the same overall sales tax rate in the City, the reduction of the sales and use tax currently levied for the promotion and development of new and expanded business enterprises by the Melissa Industrial and Economic Development Corporation from a rate of 1/2 of 1% to 1/4 of 1%.
